Zufoli:

- 2. A portmanteau word meaning the size of an iron used by iron manufacturers

Stenohaline:

Verecund:

Komondor:

First Walk of 2024: Friday 19th January

We will meet at Manor Farm Shop and Cafe, Main Street, Catthorpe LE17 6DB. Please meet here at 10.45 am to order lunch. The walk will start at 11.00 am.

The walk takes us through the village, past the Latvian Centre to Lilbourne Church and village. (See the adjacent photo from my visit there on December 23rd.)

Whilst most of this circular rural walk is along lanes and quiet roads the last section will be along a footpath and across one field (no stiles). The walk is 2.9 miles.

Directions from Lutterworth to Catthorpe Manor Farm Shop and Café, LE17 6DB

- 1. From Lutterworth, take the Rugby Road down to the A5 Gibbet Cross roundabout.
- 2. Take the second left at the roundabout to the A5 south.
- 3. Just under 2 miles later, the road/signs to Catthorpe will be on the lefthand side. It is called Rugby Road.
- 4. The farm shop is on your left once you reach the village. There is quite a large car park and plenty of room to park on the side of the road if necessary.

The walk took place on the second Wednesday in December to avoid the busy Christmas period. There were 11 walkers that started from the Newton Lindford car park in Bradgate Park. There would have been 12 but one walker got stuck in a traffic jam near Whetstone and failed to arrive. Although we managed to almost complete the walk without it raining (there was actually a couple of minutes) it was grey and overcast and the recent wet weather made the first part particularly sloshy". It was uphill and there was a strong keen wind blowing in our faces. Full credit to the walkers they didn't complain (well not to me) and they gallantly soldiered on. We followed the park perimeter wall passing the Hunts Hill Gate and eventually reaching Hallgates to join the tarmacadam path. As we walked along the path we watched students from Loughborough University training. Running, sometimes sprinting, back and forth from the Visitors Centre to Hallgates. On reaching the Deer Barn Café we stopped for a break. Sue and I produced some mince pies out of our rucksacks which went down well. A couple went into the café, such luxury! We then continued on along the path to the Bradgate House ruins where we turned off to ascend towards Old John. Everybody appeared to enjoy the fresh air and the delightful scenery that Bradgate offers.

Meeting Point For Lifts:- Lutterworth Recreation Ground car park at **09.15am** to leave at **09.20am**.

Start Point and Time:- Wharf Inn, Welford (NN6 6JQ) at 10:00am. Toilets will be available.

Directions to start:- Leave Lutterworth southbound towards the Whittle roundabout. Join the A4303 crossing the motorway to pass through Walcote and North Kilworth. After leaving North Kilworth and passing the marina, take the first right onto Station Road towards Welford. At the next T-junction, turn right. After about 1mile, the Wharf Inn is on your right. The entrance is before the pub, with ample parking behind

Route and Distance:- The route is essentially the Mary Gilbert Walk, a mix of canal towpaths. field paths, tracks and hard surfaces, which a lot of us have done many times before. There will be a couple of small variations. There is, unfortunately, a lot of canal walking but with the very wet weather we have had recently, with not much sign of it improving, we were struggling to find a walk without too much mud (we got red carded last year for that). Saying that, unless it is frozen underfoot there "will" still be "some" mud. The distance is approximately 5 miles with 3 stiles.

Lunch Arrangements:- We will pre-order before we set off on the walk. Lite Bites start from £7:50. Sandwiches or a fuller menu are also available. Alas, no crumble but there is sticky toffee pudding.
